Learning Bari

- It's important to learn Bari because that's how you know the background and where you come from.
- Our language is part of us.
- Encourage parents to reinforce the Bari language so we can pass the message of Bari.

- 5% of kids know Bari. We can't teach the language without tools. What tools do we have?
- Love yourself as a Bari person. Be proud of yourself being a Bari
- Encourage parents to talk in Bari
- Talk about why you're Bari
- Teach Bari to the new generation
- Challenge to Bari: We've adopted other languages. English and Arabic

Marriage: What's the meaning of dowry and why do we pay it?

- We pay it because we always have done it.
- The woman is a queen and the man needs to worship that
- The man is single and needs companionship therefore need the woman.
- It is tradition. It's sign of respect.
- Two families come together and figure it out.
- It's fun
- No separation is expected in Bari marriage
- Marriage and dowry shows that a woman is taken
- Parents made "you" a good woman. Dowry is a thank you to the parents
- Dowry is not selling
- They can give cows and goats. 12 cows and 24 goats
- Money comes later. It does not need to paid in full.
- Dowry is what the family can afford—baskets of food, elephant tail.

Gender roles

- Girls learn from mothers. Men do hard labor, cultivate.
- Bari culture, men do not go to the kitchen
- Men respected women

Dialogue followed by presentation and skit from Sudo.

Francis Limbe on youth program

- We need to create Youth chapter and amend Parara bylaws
- Spirit of community choir. We must organize choir groups.
- Let's create Drama group that led by the youth. We must support the youth programs.

International Bible in Bari

Bible translated in Bari. Talking Bibles. Found online. \$50. Helpful for those who cannot read Bari. Help with listening.

Dr. Lako Tongun

- Who are the Bari and where do they come from?
- Where did the Bari come from?
- Bari means foreigner –Barinit. How you construct language and its grammar is important
- Nilotic, came from the North. Cindiru is the cradle of Bari civilization
- Bari attacked the Mahadi. Nyarsuk led a fight against the Mahadi
- Made it difficult for Gordon to make it to Buganda kingdom
- What was the British policy regarding Bari? Education was limited for Bari in Gondokoro and Bari.
- Bari have proved themselves in spite of the obstacles put before them by the British
- Education is important. Encourage youth to educate their children and to push them to learn.

Sokiri Parara Report

- Volunteering is an important service. Nothing happens without sacrifice.
- We all have to give up some of our time or money.
